## Ladies Driving Program



A Ladies Driving Program is in response to a request by some of the club's ladies to learn how to drive the Model A Ford. However, the program is open to any club member who knows how, and is licensed to drive a modern automobile.

The emphasis of the program will be on the driving and controlling differences between a modern automobile and a Model A Ford.
Unlike modern cars, the Ford Model A has no computers so the driver has to manually control everything. In order to start and drive the Model A, the driver must manually control the ignition timing, the air/fuel mixture and supply, the clutch movement and the transmission shifting.
If you would like to learn how to drive a Model A, please arrive early $(6: 30)$ for the August meeting and we will discuss these differences and other tidbits of Model A driving.
