MAFFI NEWSLETTER MINUTES

Through the generosity of Donna Lewis, former MAFCA President and MAFFI Trustee, "Betsy", a 1930 Ford Model A has been donated to help raise funds for the expansion of the beloved Model A Ford Museum. The car remains in the same condition as restored by Red Grow in the 1950's. Enjoy driving "Betsy", your newest Model A, to your next cruise-in or car show. This is a truly historical vehicle, once owned by a MAFFI Hall of Fame inductee.

"Betsy", became famous as the best Model A in the world. The Ford Model A has gathered 32 top place trophies in the 34 shows which the car was entered. That includes two national shows in 1957 and 1962. Overall, the car won 39 trophies. It is said that Red Grow's car, "Betsy", was an inspiration at the time. It drove many people to do their best in restoring their own car. This urge to do the best restoration possible, developed the need for more information about how to a better job. As a result, the Judging Standards evolved. We can thank Red Grow and the MAFCA founders for their vision.



In 1967, Red sold "Betsy" to a Ford car dealer named Dave Grubbs for \$5,000, an unheard-of price in those days. As a result, Dave Grubb placed the car in a glass cage centered in his dealer showroom. 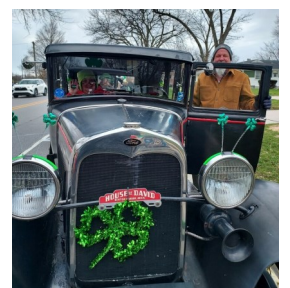

Tech Tips for Model 'A' Drivers

What you can do to upgrade your Model 'A'



Over the years technical articles have been written on *'How to Restore Your Model A'* until we have run out of things to talk about.

After thinking about this for quite a while and being asked a few times by our newsletter editor for just a couple of articles, I have come up with a series of tips or information on what you can do to make your Model 'A' more drivable in modern times and traffic.

Just think about it: The Model 'A' is eighty years old. It deserves to be retired and basking in a warm clean garage, waxed and polished, tires aired up and being looked at by reminiscing senior people who have tears in their eyes, or by young *hot-rodders* that are drooling to put a big block engine in it and a set of slicks on the rear wheels.

Well, I've got news for you – **The Model 'A' ain't done yet!!!** It's got a lot more miles to travel, shows to go to, parades to thrill the masses and just outright pleasurable touring to participate in for the next - *who knows* - how many years.

The thing that has changed more than the car is the country. Just think, no more one lane dirt roads with holes, bumps, ruts and ditches. No more improved gravel roads that crack the windshield and knock the paint off the car and put holes in radiators and tires.

We now drive on smooth two and four lane highways some even on expressways. The way we use our cars is completely different than the way; and for the purpose it was designed.

Originally the car was perfect for the conditions and for the purpose it was designed. That is why it has lasted through the depression, the Second World War, (when many lesser cars were scrapped for the war effort) and then to work and back home, to college and grad school, and finally to club meetings and drive outs.

The new conditions we drive them in, namely higher touring speeds, less stops and starts and much longer distances have begun to take a toll on the parts that were designed for strength and durability at slower speeds and shorter distances. The basic design is sound and needs only some updating to make sure *Your Grandfather's Car* will be around and running for your grandchildren to enjoy.

It is not my intention to turn every Model 'A' into a *gear head* or *hot-rodder*. Nor is it my intention to change the looks of the Model 'A' into a street rod. I think it's beautiful the way Henry built it. The tips and upgrades that I will write about have come about out of a need to make the car smoother, more durable, safer and more dependable. I said nothing about faster and that is because most Model 'A's can go faster than they are safe to drive. If you go down a long smooth hill, can you see the speedometer reaching 65 or 70 MPH --- get a good grip on the steering wheel because the air moving under the front fenders is lifting the car up. The steering is easy (less effort to turn). Now suppose an eighteen-wheeler passes you going the other way, and the wind off the front of his truck catches you under the sun visor.... very thrilling to say the least. Many things affect old cars in modern traffic. Some will be explained in several following articles. I do not propose that we ruin Henry's Lady; I just want to refine her. My intention is not to offend the 'Fine Point Purest', (I own a 'Fine Point Marc of Excellence' car myself), but I think we owe this series to the people that **drive** their cars.
